

# Parent Handbook

How to Reach Me

- 1. Message in the Brightwheel app, preferred over text messaging. It is more secure.
- 2. Through email at <u>info@forestfriendsschool.com</u> or <u>laura@forestfriendsschool.com</u>. I check email once daily Monday Friday.
- 3. By phone or text 9 am 3 pm, M-F. I will do my best to respond within these hours. I will give my number out to current enrolled families or families taking tours.
- 4. If you call, email, or Brighwheel message after 3 pm or on the weekend I will get back to you the next business day.

#### What is Forest Friends?

Forest Friends is a small, private, part-time Pre-K program for 4 & 5 year olds. We believe in using the tools of nature and nurture to support young children's development. We build social and play skills, creativity, resiliency, and nature connection in a small, supportive environment. We aim to spend a minimum of 50% of our school day outdoors in all weather.

#### Curriculum

Forest Friends focuses heavily on social and character development through rich play and interactions with peers, teachers, and nature. We secondarily introduce phonics, math concepts, and writing skills in short group and individual lessons and hands-on projects.

Traditional Kindergarten-readiness skills such as letter recognition, phonemic awareness, numeracy, geometry, art supply use and writing skills are built into the curriculum.

We believe these foundational skills build the gross motor, fine motor, memory, and planning ability necessary for academic pursuits later in school.

Routines, garden and woodworking tools, animal care, songs, story times, nature journaling, crafts, a letter of the week, math ideas, circle time lessons, individual lessons, and open-ended creativity are regular tools in our curriculum "toolbox".

Families desiring more academic focus may want to supplement our program with fine motor and reading work at home, and others may want to alternate days with an academic-focused preschool. I can suggest at-home resources based on your child's readiness, just ask!

#### Is your child ready?

- 4 or 5 years of age on or before September 1, 2024
- Older 3 year olds showing signs of readiness may be admitted with teacher approval
- 6<sup>th</sup> birthday no earlier than January 1, 2025
- Can walk over varied terrain
- Is able to transition to different environments (home to store, leaving friends' house, etc.)
- Can communicate basic needs (thirsty, hungry, sad, etc.)
- Fully independent toileting

## Spiritual aspects

We believe that spiritual formation of the child is the parent's right and responsibility. However, young children are inherently spiritual and ask many deep questions about the world!

*All families, of all beliefs, are welcome at our school.* We also want to be clear about what spiritual formation may take place at school. While we are not a Christian school per se, we are a school run by Christians and I do teach from a Judeo-Christian worldview. This looks like:

- A prayer of gratitude to start each day at first circle, acknowledging God as Creator, protector (including learning prayer etiquette).
- Monthly Biblical Proverb that connects to our character learning (including verse reference)
- Learning language of things being "created", "made", and "intended".
- Observation/naming of Christmas and Easter as holidays.
- Deferring and communication with parents about sensitive subjects if questions come up from the child's perspective.

#### Observation and take-home work

We have a Fall conference once I've gotten to know your child and have made observations on their play, art, and other activities at school. We will meet and talk about your goals for the year and how we can best support your child for the rest of the school year. I'll repeat these observations again in the Spring so we will have a record of their growth areas during our time together.

Many of our art activities are choice and process-based, and we will move into a few more group participation "crafts" as the year progresses (with plenty of process art too!). The amount and type of work coming home will vary by child, and photos on Brightwheel (see below) are another place you may see more of your child's creative work at school.

## Brightwheel

We use the Brightwheel platform for registration, tuition and fee payments, signing forms and releases, medical info, and photos/communications with you! This app is required for all families.

Make sure you install the app with notifications ON as well as set up your forms and payment preferences on the desktop version. Any regular pickup people will also need the app and notifications on their phone.

## Registration, Payment, and Refunds

#### **Registration**:

A supply fee of \$80 and a deposit of one full month's tuition (which will be applied to your last month's tuition) is required for registration.

This amount can be paid as an initial payment of 50% of the supply fee plus 50% one month tuition and the balance **due no later than July 1, 2024** to hold your spot for the fall.

Each Month's tuition is due in full by the 5<sup>th</sup> and *paid in advance* for that month. Tuition payment months are September through April; May tuition is covered by your initial deposit. For example, tuition paid by September 5<sup>th</sup> is for the month of September.

#### Payment:

After the 5<sup>th</sup>, two notices of unpaid tuition will be given. If that month's tuition is left unpaid by the 15<sup>th</sup>, the deposit paid at time of registration will be applied to your account to cover the unpaid balance, and the child will be excused from the program effective the last day of that month.

If your child needs to leave the school at any time during the month, for any reason, that month's tuition and all registration and supply fees are non-refundable.

#### Refunds:

Tuition is comprehensive and not the same as paying for hourly or daily child care. **Tuition** includes all breaks and holiday closures as well as 2 weather or teacher absence days for the school year; averaged across the 9 month school year as a whole.

We cannot offer partial refunds to accommodate vacations, sick days, etc.

If your class has more than two weather or teacher absence closures I will schedule make up days.

Supply fees are nonrefundable; they cover the start-up supplies for your child. If you leave the program before it starts and I can fill your spot, I will refund the supply fee. Once the program starts, I cannot refund this fee.

#### 2-Week Trial Period

If a child is inconsolable, overly aggressive, unable to stay with the group when outdoors, or is otherwise not ready for preschool as determined by the teacher(s) after the first two weeks of school, the family will be asked to leave the school with no partial refunds given for that month. The last months' tuition paid as a deposit will be refunded once the empty roster spot is filled.

#### **Behavior Policies**

**Respect** is a top value for Forest Friends! We are respectful to one another, our classroom, and living things. We have an expectation of respect from student to teacher, and between teacher and parents.

Teachers respect children's thoughts, feelings, and interests. Behavior issues will be addressed using respect as our baseline.

When disputes arise between the children, they will be given tools to self-regulate and find solutions. This is a large part of what we are "really" learning in preschool – how to get along with others!

If a child is using purposeful, disrespectful verbal or body language *after having clear understanding* of the expected behavior, we use 1-2-3 Magic (resulting in a break/time out). We do not count to get children to "do" things or use breaks/time outs for other behavior issues.

Children will never be left alone or out of sight when working through behavior issues. The teachers/staff will never use abusive, neglectful, humiliating, or frightening punishment. Any major behavioral events will be witnessed and documented in our accident/incident log on Brightwheel by the lead teacher, with follow up communication immediately with all parents of involved children.

Extreme physical or verbal aggression of a child towards peers or teachers will not be tolerated and will result in removal from the program, and this can happen at any time during the school year.

Destructive or abusive behavior of a child towards animals, plants, my home, or classroom items will also result in removal from the program.

Should a child need to be dismissed from the school due to behavioral issues, there will be no refunds of that month's tuition, or supply fees. Deposits may or may not be refundable in this instance, depending on if I can fill that child's spot (teacher's discretion).

#### Drop-off and Pick-up

#### Drop off: NO EARLIER than 9:05, school begins at 9:15 am.

Pick up: 1 pm, please be on time as we do not have after-care.

Forest Friends starts and ends each session at our fenced Forest Playground area. Please take your child to the restroom before coming to class and checking in with the teacher, either at home or upon arrival. Make sure your child has the appropriate clothes for the day.

If someone other than the parent dropping off will be picking up, let the instructor know ahead of time. If it is someone we haven't met before we will check their ID against your child's pick-up list given at registration.

We understand life happens, but please make every effort to be on time picking up your child. Children whose parents are habitually very late (15 minutes or more) may be excused from the program.

If you know your child will be out one day, please contact us via text or Brightwheel.

## Illness and Injury Policy

Forest Friends is for well children only and *remember that we will be spending half of class outdoors*. Fever, any diarrhea, vomiting, profuse or thick nasal discharge, severe skin rash *within the last 48 hours* before class means that your child should **stay home that day even** 

**if they are currently symptom-free**. Feeling sick while you are outside playing in the rain is not fun. Additionally, we are a very high-touch environment and germs can spread quickly!

Bumps, scrapes, and tumbles are a part of normal outdoor play. If a child has a minor injury that can be addressed by the instructor (scrape, fall, etc.) an injury report will be sent Brightwheel.

Head injuries always result in a phone call home. We do not administer medicine of any type (with the exception of epi-pen for life threatening allergy).

Children who become sick or injured to the point of needing to go home or medical attention during the program will have the parent contacted immediately.

If a parent has a pattern of <u>knowingly</u> bringing a sick child to school (2 or more documented incidents of intentionally bringing a child not meeting the wellness criteria stated above), I reserve the right to dismiss that family from the program.

#### **Inclement Weather and Cancellation**

We are rain, snow, or shine – outdoors every day, about 1.5 to 2 hours, during our 4-hour school day.

However, if weather events are extreme - temperatures or windchill below 15 degrees Fahrenheit, gusty winds, hail, thunderstorms, air quality index in the "red" zone - class will be moved indoors for all or part of that day.

We may have to cancel class based on road conditions due to snow or ice or potential treefall. If we deem that our roads are not safe, we will contact that day's classes by 8 am.

Our driveway is steep and I make every effort to clear it in a timely way, however, when I am teaching I cannot also remove snow or ice for pickup time. Your vehicle will need, at a minimum, snow tires in the winter to guarantee safe access, or you may want to arrange carpool with another family.

## Safety Policies

Children will be taught to stay together and given cues, games, and reminders so we are always moving about as a group. Children that have repeated trouble with escape behaviors (leaving the group or wandering, not listening when asked to stay within sight) will be excused from the program.

We have specific policies for outdoor activities such as tree climbing, sledding, hiking, etc. Please ask if you'd like to see them. All our assistants, teachers, and the property owner's family over the age of 12 have current extended background checks through the state of Idaho on file.

## Visitor and Volunteer Policies

Once school begins, parents and other adults bringing children to school are asked to leave. Teachers can assist in helping children transition to the school day if this becomes difficult. Parents staying too long at drop off can heighten drop-off problems.

Occasionally we have parents lead a special story time or craft project – if this is something you're interested in just let me know and we can plan it together! I will also reach out from time to time for parent volunteers for special events and projects.

There will be special events set up throughout the school year, as well as student conferences. These days will be special for your child as well - a chance to share their progress and growth with you!

## Social Media

If you do not wish your child's likeness in any form to be used on social media, please let us know by signing the opt-out form on Brightwheel at time of registration. We post to our website, Instagram, and Facebook. We do not tag, post names or use other identifying features.

## Picture / Video sharing policy

Due to the nature of running a business at my home,

I ask that you not take or publicly share photos or videos that expressly show the school grounds, classroom, or my home without my permission. This includes all social media platforms.

This is different from photos of your child with school grounds in the background. Please ask if you need clarification.

Please do not tag "Forest Friends School" or myself, my family members, or employee names, in social media without my permission.

Do not publicly share photos that include other children without those parents' expressed permission.

#### Parents will need to supply:

- Sunscreen apply before class
- Insect repellent -apply before class (fall/spring)
- Labeled water bottle and warm drink thermos (if needed), filled for the day
- Daily snack for your child
- Handwarmers if your child likes them
- Classroom slippers with grip (Croc-style shoes work great), to be left at school
- Child dressed for the weather (see Dress for Success!)
- Backpack your child can carry and manage on their own for water and snack and extra gloves/hat.

• Backup clothing (underwear, long johns, socks) left in cubby in case of accident

#### Dress for Success!

With the right layers, your child can be comfortable playing outdoors in almost any weather! The wrong layers can be uncomfortable or frustrating for your child; and result in the entire class needing to go indoors.

Our temperatures can run at least 5 degrees cooler than town, and we get more dew, frost, and precipitation as well. Your child will be running, crawling, and scooting on wet, cold ground for at least half of their day. These core recommendations typically apply October through April.

- LAYER 1 Base: non-cotton (polyester or wool) top and bottom.
- LAYER 2 Mid/Insulating: fleece (for cool weather) OR puffy (for cold weather)
- LAYER 3 Snow: snow suit or bibs/jacket
- LAYER 4 Rain or Mixed conditions: Rain suit or rain pants/jacket
- EXTREMITIES:
  - 2 pairs of one-size gloves and 1-2 pairs of outer mittens. Mittens with large wrist gauntlets that the child can pull on/off themselves are my preference.
  - A winter hat
  - *insulated* boots such as Bogs, Muds, or Kamik. Rain boots or sneakers without insulation only in temps of 50 or greater.
  - WOOL or POLYESTER tall socks if we are below 50 degrees. Cotton play socks do not keep little toes warm.

Please contact me if you have questions about what to dress your child in or need help finding items.

#### Birthdays

We would love to recognize your child's birthday at Forest Friends! We also aim to keep our special celebrations simple so as not to overwhelm.

A few days before your child's birthday, I'll invite you to send me one picture of your child for each year of life that has happened, starting with newborn (for example, if your child is turning 5: newborn, 1, 2, 3, and 4). You can also include one fun fact about your child for each year of age ("when he was one, he loved avocadoes", "when she was two, she liked to climb up on the dining table", etc.).

At the end of our school day (around 12:40) we will have our special birthday time. We tell a story about their life while in our circle using the pictures and fun facts you provided. This is extra special for the birthday child and helps all the children understand the passage of time. After our ceremony, we can share a special snack if you choose to send one in (totally optional).

I acknowledge there are risks inherent with any outdoor activity and fully assume and accept those risks. As the legal parent/guardian of the minor child listed below, I release and waive any and all future claims, demands and causes of action which the undersigned may in the future have against Forest Friends, LLC d/b/a Forest Friends School, their members, agents, and employees, for any and all injury or damages arising or resulting from my child's participation in the outdoor recreation and educational programs offered by Forest Friends, LLC.

5. I agree to pay monthly tuition as outlined in the "Registration, Payment, and Refunds" section of the above document. If payment is not received on a tuition month by the 15<sup>th</sup> of that month, I understand that my deposit will be applied and my child will be dismissed from the program at the end of the month in which tuition was not paid. I understand and acknowledge that the fees and deposit paid at time of registration are non-refundable.
